File Storage Cabinet 20

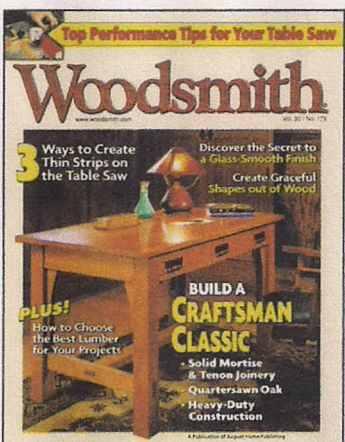
The classic appearance of this file cabinet isn't all the project has to offer. The challenge of building it will keep you on your toes.
